What is NARCAN? Narcan (also known as naloxone) is a medication that can reverse the effects of an overdose, such as slowed or stopped breathing.

Why is it important to distribute
Narcan? Studies have shown that the more
Narcan in a community the less risk of
overdose death. Narcan distribution events
make this life-saving medication available to
friends, family, and other bystanders most
likely to be able to save the life of someone
at risk of an opioid overdose.

What are PODs?

PODs(Points of Distribution) are events designed to teach people about the signs of overdose and how to use Narcan to prevent overdose deaths. They can be very large or fairly small.

There are two kinds of PODs:

- Classroom style 1 hour classroom-style set up with an instructor and volunteers
- Shortened version 10 to 15 minutes, often outdoors (parking lots, parks) with only a few tables and volunteers
